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Ms. Tamrakar opened up the session by providing a brief on gender role in our modern day society as well as in our workplace. She further emphasized that with the global and technical advances, we can witness many changes and women empowerment taking place in our workplace. The moderator forwarded her first question to Dr. Amina Singh to provide her insights on the emerging gender issues in our workplace. Dr. Singh stated that gender issue has always been there and to be able to mitigate this one needs to

understand what does gender really mean and could always adopt best practices and ideas to tackle with this issue. She focused on the social norms that we have been practicing for a long period of time and the need to understand whether we solve our social problem first or the problem at workplace. When we talk about gender equality, it is both beneficial to males as well as females.

She further stated that being a woman is definitely going to be a tough journey to fulfill a variety of roles and women needed to accept the fact that they are not a superwoman.

Ms. Tamrakar closed the session with a concluding remark that "As an HR professional, I need to ponder upon what I can do to balance gender bias and what is my role in it."
